POLICY ON OFFICIAL LANGUAGES

Policy Statements:

- 1. Dragon Boat Canada ("DBC") recognizes that English and French languages enjoy equal status in Canada. DBC recognizes English and French as its official languages.
- 2. DBC's objective is to comply with the spirit and intent of Part IV of the *Official Languages Act*.
- 3. DBC is committed to serving its members and the public in both official languages.

Implementation:

- 4. All letters and other forms of written communications received by DBC are to be replied to in the originating language.
- 5. Any publication which is of an official nature (eg. by-laws, regulations, policies, rules, etc.) is to be translated into both languages. Any publication of a technical nature which will be in circulation for a long period of time (i.e. rules, manuals) and not subject to constant updating, shall be available in both official languages.
- 6. Information posted on DBC's website is to be in English and French.
- 7. DBC forms, including membership application forms, are to be in English and French.
- 8. Notices of meetings to DBC members are to be in English and French.
- 9. Contracts made with a Canadian person or entity are to be prepared in the language of preference (French or English) of the contracted person.
- 10. Major materials produced for National and International Championships are to be in English and French.
- 11. DBC's name, logo, letterhead, and business cards shall be in English and French.

Simultaneous translation at Annual General Meetings will be provided if requested and if funding permits.
